Punjab Municipal Infrastructure Development Company (PMIDC), Chandigarh invites EoI from the eligible agencies with requisite authorization/ approvals from the Authorities concerned for the purpose of purchasing/ lifting/ processing/ co-processing of plastic wastes including MLPs from the ULBs of Punjab for scientific & safe disposal. EXPRESSION OF INTEREST (EoI) FOR MANAGEMENT OF PLASTIC WASTE GENERATED IN JURISDICTION OF THE URBAN LOCAL BODIES IN PUNJAB STATE (INDIA)

- Background: The PMIDC under the aegis of Department of Local Government, Punjab intends to attain and sustain garbage free clean cities by scientific management of plastic and other non-biodegradable wastes including MLPs in a time bound in compliance of Punjab Plastic Carry Bags (Manufacture, Usage and Disposal) Control (Amendment) Act, 2016, Punjab State Solid Waste Management Policy, 2018 and Plastic Waste Management Rules (Amended), 2018, 2021 and 2022, NGT Orders dated 20th January, 2016 in OA No.442/2015 and amendments therein from time to time. About 4100 TPD solid waste including plastic/ MLP is generated in all 166 ULBs of Punjab. Engagement of Agency(ies) will enable the ULBs in the scientific disposal of plastic/ MLP wastes; it will play an important role in attaining & sustaining Garbage Free Cities status.
- 2. Objectives: The key objective is to facilitate the ULBs to ensure scientific & effective management of plastic waste including MLPs by involving the Agencies under EPR provisions under PWM Rules and SWM Rules, various stakeholders and effective implementation of the provisions of Punjab Plastic Carry Bags (Manufacture, Usage and Disposal) Control (Amendment) Act, 2016 and Plastic Waste Management Rules (Amended) 2018, 2021 and 2022.
- 3. Plastic Waste: Plastic Waste means the i) Dry mixed plastic waste (LDPE/PP/HM/PET) include Multi Layer Plastics (MLPs), packaging materials, polystyrene (thermocol) and polypropylene (Category-I) and ii) Dry shoes/ chappals, tube-tiers and other rubber items (Category-II) for the purpose of purchase, lifting and treatment/ final disposal by the Agency(ies).

Whereas:-

- LDPE (Low density poly ethylene) i.e. Film grade pouches, shrink film, milk pouch, squeeze bottles, laminations etc.
- PP (Poly propylene) i.e. Plastic/ non biodegradable bags, masks, bottle caps, bottles etc.
- HM (High molecular plastic) i.e. Carry bags etc.
- PET (Polyethylene terephthalate) i.e. plastic bottles
- MLP laminate i.e. Food packaging, lays packaging, chocolate & toffee wrappers etc.

4. Scope of Work

- The work of purchase/ lifting and scientific disposal in each Category of waste will be allotted to the Agency quoting highest purchase rate for that particular category of waste. It means, 1 to 2 Agencies may work in the same Group of the ULBs for two different categories of the waste.
- ii. In case, both agencies quote same price the division of group may be decided by PMIDC.
- iii. If sufficient number of bidders applied, maximum three groups of ULBs will be given to the eligible agency quoting higher purchase rate. In case, less number of bidders, PMIDC may decide subsequently for allotment of more than three groups of ULBs to the eligible agencies.
- **iv.** The Agency will be responsible to purchase, lift, process and dispose of the plastic waste at the agreed rates from the designated places/ Material Recovery Facilities in the concerned ULB(s) on the fixed intervals or as decided mutually for a period of one year from the date of signing of agreement/ consent letter and extendable upto 3 years on the basis of performance and mutual consent in written at their own cost.
- v. The rates shall be agreed depending on quality of plastic waste and manpower competency.
- vi. The Agency will be responsible to lift and transport the plastic waste from the designated places/ Material Recovery Facilities of the ULBs at their own cost. The ULBs will share the list of designated places/ Material Recovery Facilities with the Agency for smooth functioning. The Agency will make the on-spot payment to the ULBs via electronic transfer for the plastic waste purchased and lifted from the designated points as per agreed rates.
- vii. Only GPS enabled vehicle(s) to be deployed for the purpose of collection and transportation of the plastic waste. The timings/ interval details for collection/ lifting and purchase of plastic waste will be fixed and decided mutually by the parties.
- viii. The Agency will ensure the safe and scientific disposal of the collected plastic waste as per Punjab Plastic Carry Bags (Manufacture, Usage and Disposal) Control (Amendment) Act, 2016, the Plastic Waste Management Rules (Amended) 2018, 2021 & 2022, Punjab Solid Waste Management Policy 2018 and NGT orders time to time. The Agency will provide the valid disposal certificate as a documentary proof(s) of safe and scientific disposal of the collected plastic waste mandatorily.

- **ix.** The Agency will hold the training camps at their own cost at the intervals of 6 months with the support of concerned ULBs for the waste collectors/ rag pickers/ ULB staff/ persons involved in waste collection/ segregation and may also conduct the awareness activities regarding importance of source segregation/ waste management. The Agency(ies) to be involved for the purpose of trainings must to have legal entity/ registered and having relevant experience in the area of solid waste management activities and sanitation & hygiene. Proper record of the trainings programmes to be maintained and make the payments, if any, via electronic transfer to the agency(ies) deployed for imparting trainings.
- **x.** The Agency will submit the monthly report regarding plastic waste purchased, lifted, processed, technology involved and training camps organized etc to the ULBs concerned and PMIDC every month.
- 5. Conditions: The whole management process from purchase/ collection to its scientific and safe disposal should to be as per Punjab Plastic Carry Bags (Manufacture, Usage and Disposal) Control (Amendment) Act, 2016, Punjab State Solid Waste Management Policy, 2018 and Plastic Waste Management Rules (Amended), 2018, 2021 & 2022, NGT Orders and guidelines of Punjab Pollution Control Board from time to time.
- **6. Eligibility:** The Agency should fulfill the following conditions to become eligible:
 - i. The Agency should be a registered entity under law.
 - ii. The Agency should not have been black listed by any Agency/ Government.
 - The Agency (individual or associates) should have minimum monthly capacity 50 tons of purchasing/ lifting and treatment & disposal of plastic waste as per Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 & as amended from time to time.
 - iv The successful Agency/s will deposit the performance bank guarantee of Rs. 25000/- (twenty five thousands) for each category of waste in the complete Group of ULBs and same will be forfeited on non-fulfillment of the conditions of agreement without prior notice.
- 7. **Purchase rates:** The Agency will purchase and lift the plastic waste from the designated places in the ULBs concerned and will make payment to the ULB as under:

***Note:** i) Agreed rates may be increase per kg waste depending on quality of plastic waste and manpower competency.

ii) If the ULB get higher rate for the segregated dry waste from the market shall have discretion to sell to the agency offers higher rates.

- 8 Technical proposal: The technical proposal should be submitted as per format mentioned in Annexure –II.
- 9 Submission of Proposal: The interested Agency have to submit the application in the prescribed format (Annexure-II) to Chief Executive Officer, PMIDC, 5th Floor, Punjab Municipal Bhawan, Sector 35A, Chandigarh by 8th June,2023 (5:00PM). In case the designated day is Saturday/Sunday or is declared as a public holiday, the same may be extended to next working day. PMIDC reserves the right to reject any application without assigning any reason.
- 10. **Procedure for Empanelment**: The eligible Agency(s) ready to give higher purchase rates to the ULB(s) concerned for plastic wastes collected will be selected for the purpose and a agreement will be executed between the Agency and ULBs under intimation of PMIDC, Chandigarh.

The successful Agency/s will deposit the performance amount i.e., bank guarantee of Rs. 25000/- (twenty five thousands) in PMIDC, Chandigarh, for groups of ULBs for each category and same will be forfeited on non-fulfillment of the conditions of agreement without prior notice.

11. Agreement: Agreement having detailed terms and conditions will be signed by the Agency (1st Party) and ULB (2nd Party).

12. Validity & Termination

i. This Agreement shall be valid for a period of one to three year from the date of execution and may be extended on terms mutually agreed between the parties unless expiry of the term or terminated for default as prescribed in this Agreement **up to maximum of three years.**

ii. This Agreement may be terminated by the parties with a one month prior notice to either party before expiry of the term.

13. Dispute Resolution

- i. In case of any dispute arising between the Parties to this Agreement, the same dispute shall be resolved through mutual consultation in amicable way.
- ii. In case any dispute which could not be resolved through mutual consultation shall be resolved through mediation before Chief Executive Officer, PMIDC, Chandigarh.
- iii. In case any party is not satisfied with the recommendations of mediation in the aforesaid clause, the party may approach with application for redressal to Administrative Secretary, Department of Local Government, Punjab.
- iv. In case of failure of redressal mechanism aforementioned, the parties may apply for arbitration under relevant State rules.

14. Amendment & Waiver

As per situations arises, any other term and condition may be added time to time by way of mutual consent of the parties in writing.
